

Praying for your Parish:

A resource for individuals to use at home



The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field.

Matthew 9.37-38

This little booklet provides guidance for those who wish to pray regularly for their parishes. It could be used by a prayer group, but its primary purpose is to support those whose instinct is to “go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen.”

If you’re not sure what to pray about, then your Parish Priest will be glad to talk to you about where s/he would most value your prayers at the moment.

What’s here is a framework, to which your own prayers for current local concerns can be added. We all have our preferred ways of praying, and some people will like the structure offered here but prefer to fill it with their own words. Others will prefer to read the words as they stand, and yet others will like to use a mixture of the words printed here and their own words.

Whatever our preferred, style, we can be confident that our Father *always* answers when we pray in faith.

Preparation

O God, I am in Thy presence.

Shut out the world

and all worldly things from me.

Send Thy Holy Spirit

to help my infirmities,

and bless to me this time of prayer;

through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Adoration

Do you not know? Have you not heard?
The Lord is the everlasting God,
the Creator of the ends of the earth.
He will not grow tired or weary,
and his understanding no one can fathom.

He gives strength to the weary
and increases the power of the weak.

Even youths grow tired and weary,
and young men stumble and fall;

but those who hope in the Lord
will renew their strength.

They will soar on wings like eagles;
they will run and not grow weary,
they will walk and not be faint.

Some people will like to meditate on each section of the Lord’s Prayer, linking it to their own intercessions in the style suggested overleaf. Others will prefer to say the Lord’s Prayer uninterrupted, either before or after their own intercessions. Please just use the style that feels most comfortable to you.

Our Father, who art in Heaven,
Hallowed be Thy name.

*Father, you are the source of all love. Please
increase our love for you and for each other.*

Thy Kingdom come.

Thy will be done,
in earth as it is in heaven.

*Father, please help me to discern your will and
be obedient to your guidance.*

Give us this day our daily bread.

*Father, I pray for your blessing and guidance
on . . .*

Our clergy and lay leaders . . .

Our new and ongoing initiatives . . .

And forgive us our trespasses,

*Father, I pray that you would reveal to your

Father, please show us how to reveal your healing love, your power and your glory to the people of this parish. Give us the courage to step out in obedience to you, and keep our feet on the paths you have planned for us.
